ARC to Increase

In November 2011, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) made a ruling that over the next few years they were going to move more of the network cost to those who own the network. To do this, they have set benchmarks 456-2330 for local service rates and have implemented an Access Recovery Charge (ARC) that we are required to charge our members if we want to retain our USF funding. The Access Recovery Charge enables WRCTC to recover a limited portion of revenues lost due to FCC mandated reductions in intercarrier payments. Effective July 1, 2015, residential members and single-line businesses will see their ARC increase by \$0.50 per month. Multi-line business customers will not see an increase. Therefore, the ARC for residential members and single-line businesses will increase from \$1.50 per month to \$2.00 per month, and the ARC for multi-line businesses will stay at \$3.00 per month. This will be the fourth step of the six step increase. Every July for the next two years, the ARC will increase.
